EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES STARTS HERE

Welcome to the Independent Schools Guide to Scholarships and Bursaries. We've put together this Information Pack to help inform parents and their children on a range of factors relating to the availability and application of scholarships and bursaries from many NSW independent schools. Featuring great tips to make the most of the application process, along with answers to some of your initial questions, our guide will help you get started in the right direction.

Most importantly, we have previewed each of our featured schools so you can get a feel for their specific environment and the scholarships and bursaries they have on offer.

WHAT IS THE BENEFIT OF A SCHOLARSHIP?

Scholarships are available from most independent schools. In general they offer the remission of all, or part of the tuition fees for a period of time.

HOW ARE THEY AWARDED?

Scholarships are generally open to existing students and prospective ones wishing to attend in the future. They are awarded on a variety of means from academic, boarding, character and skill-based aptitudes such as music, sports or performing arts. Often there will be conditions, or ideals, that the student will be required to uphold in order to retain the scholarship for the given time.

WHAT IS A BURSARY?

A bursary is a 'means-tested' scholarship to help families who may have financial difficulties meeting the cost of tuition fees from their preferred school. A confidential financial questionnaire may be required to demonstrate the financial need that would otherwise prevent attendance.

WHAT DOES THE PROCESS INVOLVE?

It can vary greatly from school to school. An exam (academic or practical) along with an interview or audition

could be part of the application process. It is very important that you know the specific requirements, so you can prepare your child for what's expected of them on the day. The 'testing' process is necessary so the school can more accurately gauge suitability for a scholarship or bursary.

HOW DO WE APPLY?

This guide will give you an understanding of what scholarships are available from your preferred school, however we encourage you to contact the school directly for more details so you can make an informed decision that's right for your family. A great place to start is the school's website, which we have listed on each entry in this guide. Look for the terms and conditions for each scholarship, so you have a clear understanding of what the scholarship entails. It would also be worthwhile going on a tour of your preferred schools where you will also have the opportunity to ask questions and get a better feel for the environment.

WHY CHOOSE AN INDEPENDENT EDUCATION

Independent schools come in all shapes and sizes, in a myriad of locations across Australia. The common denominator for all of these establishments is the wealth of educational, social and extra-curricular and sporting opportunities that are available.



Not to mention the dedication of staff to achieve positive outcomes for their students, and nurture them to be great learners and importantly good people that will make a meaningful impact on the world.

DIVERSITY OF CHOICE

The sheer diversity of offerings available at independent schools make them a desirable option when exploring the educational choices available to your child. Students are encouraged to try activities outside their comfort zone, to safely try different things and discover what it is they enjoy and are good at.

SPORTS

Some schools offer more than 25 sports from AFL, surfing, mountain biking, sailing and decathlons to name a few. Coaching staff range from professionally experienced sportspeople, to even ex-Olympians, providing the ultimate mentoring in specific sporting endeavours.

CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMS

Independent schools feature many high quality, co-curricular programs to challenge and develop students while complementing their main learning areas. From debating teams, public speaking, sporting competitions, chess club, art, music, drama and literary programs, the activities focus less on theory and more on practical application of skills that build personality, passions and a healthy competitive spirit.

THE QUALITY OF STAFF

Almost without exception, every independent school principal credits the expertise and dedication of the staff employed within their fraternity as one of the outstanding reasons to aspire to an education of this type. Many studies globally have found that the key to students' academic success is quality teaching and leadership. Independent schools employ highly skilled and innovative teachers who are passionate about learning and often work in teams to critically review each other's lessons and identify opportunities for change and innovation.

ACCOUNTABILITY

There is strong accountability within the teaching staff at independent schools, helping to maintain exacting teaching standards and attract motivated staff who actually want to be there. Independent schools have full say in who they employ and who they let go, allowing them to cull staff who are not meeting the standards expected.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

While independent schools offer a diverse range of programs to build a child's strengths in many different areas, they are also very focused on academic outcomes and many offer the International Baccalaureate, an internationally recognised education and testing program.

NURTURING GOODNESS AS WELL AS EXCELLENCE

Most independent schools have a religious foundation, ensuring children study in an environment supported by a set of defined values. In general, these values nurture self-discipline, respect for authority, self-reliance, safety, structure and cultural traditions. While, the decision to pursue a scholarship may be based on accessing exceptional resources on a day-to-day basis, many parents choose independent schooling for what kind of people their children become as a result of their attendance. The students not only succeed in their professions, but often take up opportunities to volunteer in a wide range of charitable activities and give back substantially to the world.

TIPS TO HELP YOUR CHILD PREPARE FOR THEIR SCHOLARSHIP ASSESSMENT

As much as schools try to make the assessment process as unintimidating as possible, there's no doubt that for a child it can often be a rather daunting process.

Actually, if we're honest – sitting tests and being interviewed is pretty daunting for us adults too! So here are some tips and ideas to ensure that your child is not only well-prepared for the assessment, but is also feeling calm and confident in themselves and their abilities.

TIP 1 DO YOU KNOW WHAT'S ACTUALLY REQUIRED?

Planning and preparation are two very important things you can help your child with.

Make sure you have a clear understanding of all requirements of your specific scholarship application process. Have the forms been completed? Does my child need to sit an exam, or prepare for an interview, or both? Perhaps they need to put together a portfolio, or practise and perform at an audition?

Plan out each requirement with plenty of time, so there is not a feeling of being rushed - rather a feeling of being ready.

TIP 2 A GOOD NIGHT'S SLEEP BOOSTS CONCENTRATION!

Getting a good night's sleep is really important for your child's concentration on the day. We know that their quality of sleep is greatly affected by erratic blood sugar and insulin levels. An important way to balance these fluctuations is to provide a good quality source of protein together with vegetables and healthy fats at the evening meal and eliminate night-time desserts or 'treats' which are high in sugar.

As much as they may protest, it's also a good idea to switch off any electronic devices at least an hour before going to bed to help the mind transition to sleep more easily.

TIP 3 MEDITATION TO CALM THE MIND

Teaching your children simple meditation techniques such as closing their eyes and focusing on their breathing is extremely helpful. Mediation is proven not only to calm the mind and reduce stress but also to improve focus and memory! You can find lots of simple guided meditations for children online.

A quick meditation might be a good idea for you too – we know this process can be just as stressful for you as a parent as it is for your child! And remember, the calmer you are, the better they will feel too.

TIP 4 TIME TO GET THE BLOOD PUMPING!

Research shows strong evidence that regular exercise (at least 3 times a week) has a direct effect on reducing anxiety and improving concentration in children. It's also a great way to clear their minds after a long day at school or as a break from studying.

Check out 'Just Dance Kids' for something a little bit different. It helps to make the exercise process fun too – you might even want to join in!



TIP 5 FUEL THE BODY WITH LONG LASTING ENERGY

After all of that exercise, your child will need a whole lot of nutritionally rich foods such as fruits, vegetables, good fats and protein to replenish their energy!

It's a great idea to boost concentration with a healthy breakfast, like a smoothie. Try mixing banana, strawberries, raspberries, yoghurt, full-cream milk/almond milk with added presoaked oats.

Some scrambled eggs with smashed avocado on whole-grain sourdough toast will also provide long-lasting energy. For ideas on how to make healthy lunchboxes that actually get eaten, check out our blog here!

TIP 6 WATCH YOUR EXPECTATIONS – PUT YOURSELF IN YOUR CHILD'S SHOES

Yes, we absolutely want our child to realise how important the interview and test process is. However, we need to be a little bit careful that we're supporting, not pressuring them to succeed.

Unrealistic expectations can easily create stress in both your child and yourself – which often leads to less than desired outcomes. Instead, try chatting to your child and ask them if there's anything else you can be doing to support and encourage them.

TIP 7 REACH OUT!

And finally, if you feel that your child is beginning to feel stressed about their upcoming assessment, reach out to family and friends who may have gone through the process. It may help your child to talk to another who has been through the process to discover that it's really not that scary!




